Wednesday, May 27 - Departure from New Orleans

Thursday, May 28 - Steep in the soul and splendor of Rome

- Walk the Spanish Steps and toss a coin into the Trevi Fountain
- Marvel at the Pantheon and Castel Sant'Angelo along the Tiber River
- Basilica of St. Agnes—her skull relics at the site of her martyrdom
- Basilicas of St. Andrew the Apostle and Santa Maria Sopra Minerva—the tomb of St. Catherine of Siena and relics of St. Thomas Aquinas
- Enjoy the charming fountains of Piazza Navona and Campo de' Fiori
- And of course—your first taste of real Roman pizza and gelato!

Friday, May 29 - Walk through history with the martyrs and saints

- Take a private tour of the Colosseum, once stained with the blood of martyrs
- Explore living history in the Roman Forum and Palatine Hill, the ancient seat of emperors
- Papal Basilica St. Mary Major—relics of Jesus' manger, incorrupt saints, and tomb of Pope Francis
